Alex K. Lam, MRAIC, IFMA Fellow Director Global Development, Aviemore | Stirling Toronto

Alex Lam is Director Global Development with Aviemore|Stirling, Toronto to develop Campuses for Humanity for 12 developing countries around the world. His professional career spans over twenty-three years as General Manager – Real Estate with Bell Canada in Toronto, and over twenty years in his global consultancy with the training and motivation of facility executives in most of the Fortune 500 companies around Asia and North America.

He is a frequent speaker at international conferences and his recent talks include FM Summit 2016 in Auckland, New Zealand on The Humanity in FM – Personal Mapping in the Physio-behavioral Environment, The 2015 WWP Asia in Singapore and WWP US in Denver on Optimal Personality in FM, 2014 WWP Asia in Beijing on Mission Critical FM and 2011 ABRAFAC Congress & Expo in San Paulo, Brazil on Disruptive FM. He has taught graduate level classes on design, leadership, outsourcing and facility management at Tsinghua University in Beijing, The University of Hong Kong, Baptist University of Hong Kong, The Polytechnic University of Hong Kong, The University of Manitoba and Ryerson University in Canada.

He has served on the Board of Trustees of the BOMI Institute, the Executive Board of the International Society of Facilities Executives (ISFE) founded by MIT, the editorial board of the Journal of Facility Management, London, UK, and the Board of Directors of IFMA and the Board of Trustees of IFMA Foundation. He authored the chapter on "Business Transformation for Facility Management" in Facility Design and Management Handbook: Theory, Practice and Technology (McGraw Hill, 2001), "Human Elements in Building Performance Evaluation" in the new Assessing Building Performance (Elsevier Butterworth-Heinemann 2005) and Core Competencies for Federal Facilities Asset Mgmt through 2020 by The National Academies of Washington, DC. (US National Research Council, 2008). He graduated from McGill University with a Bachelor of Architecture in 1967 and Ontario Theological Seminary with a Master of Theological Studies in 1995. He was elected IFMA Fellow in 2011 and Fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Facility Management in 2004.
